Into the Hairy is the new creation conceived by choreographers Sharon Eyal and Gai Behar in collaboration with musician and producer of electronic music Koreless. With the involvement of Christian Dior Couture for the costumes by Maria Grazia Chiuri.

Their unique style is what has always distinguished the disruptive duo Eyal & Behar: movement, music and space intersect, dance comes out of its conventional canons, classical blends with underground club culture and contemporary dance is pushed far beyond its boundaries.


Historical heritage of the Festival dei Due Mondi

Since 2021, the historical heritage of the Fondazione della Festival dei Due Mondi has been the subject of an important recovery and valorisation effort.


The cataloguing and restoration of documents, photographs, period sketches, costumes and scenic furnishings make it possible to narrate a theatrical journey spanning over 60 years.

The recovery of the historical and artistic heritage every year runs through the history of the Festival dei Due Mondi, through the visions and brilliant intuitions of **its founder Gian Carlo Menotti.**

The narrative itinerary includes four stops, from the exhibitions at Palazzo Collicola and the exhibition spaces of Via Aurelio Saffi, to the Documentation Centre of the Festival dei Due Mondi Casa Menotti and the Giosuè Carducci Municipal Library.











IMANY

When music enchants

Imany – stage name of Nadia Mladjao
– brings to the Festival dei Due Mondi
the sounds of Voodoo Cello, a project
in which the French singer, accompanied
by eight cellos, reinterprets the iconic
successes of pop music, putting herself
to the test with her covers of hits by
Bob Marley, Daft Punk, Imagine Dragons,
Radiohead.

Imany on stage embodies a voodoo

priestess, a character inspired by a wide
variety of cultures, who through music
and songs tells her own story.

DARK MATTER

Three immersive performances

The German choreographer Marco Goecke, touches down at the Festival dei Due Mondi with his hypnotic style of dark and very evocative atmospheres. Goecke brings to Spoleto three choreographies that are fundamental for understanding his choreographic language.

Considered as one of the greatest choreographic discoveries of the twenty-first century, what is striking about his work is the completely individual atmosphere: mysterious, magical, often sinister and sometimes even absurd. His vocabulary of movement is unique, made up of an infinite variety of movements that he combines and reinvents in each of his ballets.
